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SCRC denounces cuts to SAR

A few weeks ago, Radio-Canada decided to cut out much of the content provided by SAR (including economic, geopolitical, digital, environmental, sports, and weather chronicles), content much appreciated in regional programming. That's about 30 minutes of content daily. Management reportedly wanted to offer more local content with this decision. Some columnists have been replaced, but there are still gaping holes to fill for the regional hosts and producers. Production teams must already consider a way to offset these losses a few weeks before the start of the school year. This is particularly the case for the program "Bon pied, bonne heure!", broadcast in the Gaspésie-Îles-de-la-Madeleine region, which will have to produce more than 25 minutes of additional content in the fall. The SCRC vigorously denounces this decision by Radio-Canada, which deprives the regions of both content and diversity of voices on air. •

Regarding the webmasters

As a result of certain questions regarding the webmasters duties, here is the situation. A committee was formed last spring to study the webmasters tasks. An initial meeting with the employer was scheduled for June 25, but was postponed until July 30. We are ready to meet with the employer and we hope that he will be able to share his needs and plans with us so that we can implement the letter of agreement on the webmasters tasks (page 193 of the collective

agreement). In fact, about 30 people responded to the survey we sent, thank you for taking the time to do so. Webmasters will also be asked to collaborate within a working committee on a need-be basis. You will be kept informed of the next steps.. •
