CANDIDATE'S CODE OF ETHICS

Applying for a position on the SCRC Bargaining Committee must be part of a deeply collective process in which respect for individuals, their ideas and their commitment prohibits the use of processes, words, writings or means that run counter to the principles that guide our union's actions.

Insults, racist or inappropriate words or writings, personal attacks cannot be tolerated at any time and particularly during elections for a union position.

We must constantly keep in mind that even if ideas are conveyed by humans, a debate, including during elections, remains one of ideas and not of people. Failure to respect this principle would be detrimental to the democratic life of the union and could have devastatin effects.	g
